

Romans Bible Study Question Sunday Morning 4/12/20 EASTER

Bible passage is NOT from Romans today!!! LOL Luke 24:1-2

But very early on Sunday morning the women went to the tomb, taking the spices they had prepared. ² They found that the stone had been rolled away from the entrance. ³ So they went in, but they didn't find the body of the Lord Jesus. ⁴ As they stood there puzzled, two men suddenly appeared to them, clothed in dazzling robes.

⁵ The women were terrified and bowed with their faces to the ground. Then the men asked, "Why are you looking among the dead for someone who is alive? ⁶ He isn't here! He is risen from the dead! Remember what he told you back in Galilee, ⁷ that the Son of Man must be betrayed into the hands of sinful men and be crucified, and that he would rise again on the third day."

⁸ Then they remembered that he had said this. ⁹ So they rushed back from the tomb to tell his eleven disciples—and everyone else—what had happened. ¹⁰ It was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and several other women who told the apostles what had happened. ¹¹ But the story sounded like nonsense to the men, so they didn't believe it. ¹² However, Peter jumped up and ran to the tomb to look. Stooping, he peered in and saw the empty linen wrappings; then he went home again, wondering what had happened. Luke 24:1-2

2. What are some evidences that Jesus did rise from the dead?
3. Which of these evidences for the resurrection (#2) do you find most convincing? Why?
4. Why should Jesus' followers have anticipated the Resurrection instead of expressing fear and doubt?
5. Because Jesus rose from the dead He is called the "firstborn from the dead" (Colossians 1:18) how can that be since He raised Lazarus (and others) from the dead before His resurrection?
6. What does the Resurrection mean for us as believers?
7. What will our resurrection be like?
